Edward L. Barrier Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

- * Recipient must reside in Rutherford or Polk County
- * Recipient must have financial need.
- * Recipient must be in diploma or degree program.
- * Recipient must be at least 25 years old and must have completed at least one semester with no grade lower than a C.

Priority is given to applicants whose needs cannot be met through alternative funding sources.



The Edward L. Barrier Scholarship was established by his children as a way of honoring their father.



Jack E. Buchanan Scholarship

The Jack E. Buchanan Scholarship was established in 1988 by friends and family of Mr. Buchanan along with First Union National Bank. Mr. Buchanan served Isothermal Community College for fourteen years, six of those as the of chairman of the board of trustees. He placed the search for a literate, skilled society; academic excellence; and dedication to the “open-door policy” of the North Carolina Community College System at the top of his agenda.

Awarding Criteria:

Primary:

- Must be an entering freshman
- Must demonstrate financial need
- Must be a full-time student
- Must be a Rutherford County high school graduate

Priority given to those who complete FAFSA by May 31

Continuation:

- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher





George Chatham Business Science Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

Primary:

- Must be a North Carolina resident seeking an associate degree in Business Administration
- Must be enrolled for at least 6 hours
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

Continuation:

- Renewable up to 4 semesters at full-time or equivalent





Pinkie H. and T.D. Carson Scholarship

The Rutherfordton Lion's Club and the family of T.D. Carson established a scholarship in his name. He was one of the original charter members of the Rutherfordton Lions Club. It was established because of his keen interest in the educational development of young people in Rutherford County.

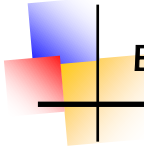


Awarding Criteria:

- Must be enrolled in the Nursing program

- Must Intend to pursue career in environmental sciences
- Must be an Arts and Science major
- Must be a Rutherford or Polk County resident
- Must demonstrate financial need

J.D. Cooley Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

Primary:

- Must be an Applied Science Major
- Must be a resident of Rutherford or Polk County

Continuation:

- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher



This scholarship fund was established by former Isothermal College Trustee, J.D. Cooley to provide funds for technical education students. Mr. Cooley hoped to help students overcome financial obstacles to their education.



Mabel E. and James B. Doggett Memorial Music Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

PRIMARY

1. Must be a graduate of a Rutherford County High School
2. Must be seeking a degree in AA program with plans to transfer to a 4 year college to earn a degree in music
3. Must demonstrate financial need

Preference given to students with:

- Good academic performance
- Involvement in music related activities
- Recommendations of teachers and counselors

CONTINUATION

1. Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher

One recipient is selected every two years

- * Must be a rising sophomore

Preference given to those who file FAFSA by May 31

CONTINUATION

- * Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher





Delta Kappa Gamma Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

Primary:

- Δ Student must be an Education or Child Care major
- Δ Student must be registered for 9 hours or more

Continuation:

- Δ If awarded to a freshman, renewable for second year
- Δ Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher

PRIMARY:

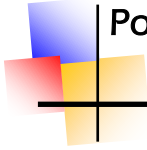
- Must demonstrate financial need

Polly Hemphill Memorial Business Science Scholarship

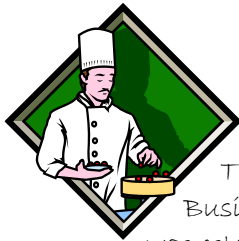
Awarding Criteria:

Hewitt Scholarship

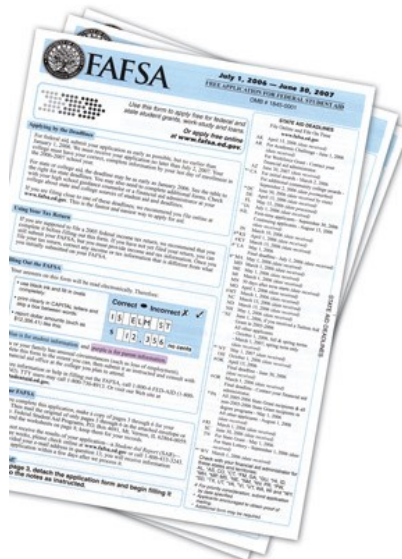
The scholarship was established by Mr. & Mrs. Richard Hewitt to enable students to pursue higher education.

- * Must complete a William V. Lee Memorial Scholarship Application available in the Financial Aid Office (scholarship has a special deadline)

Andrew Major Scholarship

The Andrew Major Scholarship was established by Flora Major in memory of her husband. Mr. Major was recognized worldwide as a preeminent textile pioneer and was referred to as "The King of the Mills." He was founder of Mastercraft Corporation in Rutherfordton, which with his leadership became the world's largest jacquard mill. He was also instrumental in creating Cone Jacquards in Cliffside.



Awarding Criteria:

Primary:

- Must be a Commercial Graphics or Art major
- Must submit portfolio to support application
- Preference given to students with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Recommendation from scholarship committee will be considered if student does not meet GPA requirement.

Not need based but may be considered when students of equal talent meet criteria

Continuation:

- Renewable for four semesters
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher



James Monroe McDonald Scholarship

The James Monroe McDonald Memorial Scholarship was established by Mildred and D.L. "Doc" Furches in memory of Mrs. Furches' brother. James McDonald was a college supporter from its earliest history. He was the son of the late Monroe and Ada Moore McDonald for whom Adaville Baptist Church is named. He grew up on the McDonald farm which is adjacent to the Isothermal Campus and attended Oakland School and R-S Central High School.

McDonald was superintendent of Laurel Mills for 15 years and served as director of the Rutherford County Farm Bureau for 25 years. He established the Ada McDonald Garden at Adaville Baptist Church in memory of his mother and was a member of the cemetery committee.

- Must be enrolled in 12 or more credit hours
- Must be an R.S. Central Graduate
- Must demonstrate financial need
- Must be motivated
- Must be a good citizen
- Must demonstrate solid achievement in high school
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher

Preference given to those who file FAFSA by May 31

CONTINUATION:

- One recipient is selected every other year
- Must enroll in 12 or more credit hours each semester
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher

May receive for 2 years





Monroe and Ada Moore McDonald Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

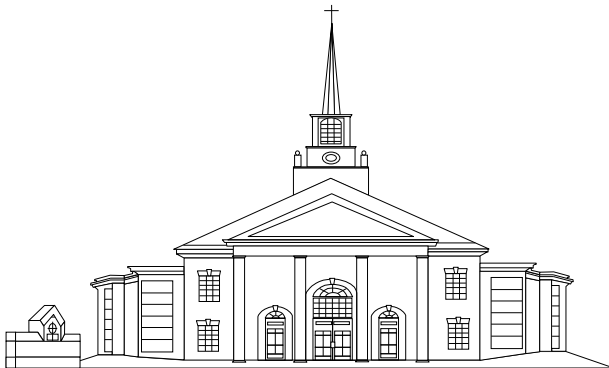
PRIMARY:

- Based on need, motivation, solid achievement in high school and good citizenship
- No limitation to the high school that a student graduated from or the academic program for which they are enrolled
- Student must be full-time
- Recipient may attend Polk or Spindale Campus
- Any division of the college is eligible for this scholarship – Arts and Sciences, Applied Sciences and Technology, or Business Sciences

CONTINUATION:

- Is renewable for second year, if criteria is met
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher

The Scholarship was established by their daughter, Mildred McDonald Furches. Mr. and Mrs. McDonald were parents of eight children who were raised on the land that Isothermal Community College now occupies. Adaville Baptist Church was named in honor of Mrs. McDonald who gave the land for the church. Mr. McDonald was a deacon and church clerk at Adaville Baptist Church and served on the building committee.





W.H. "Shorty" McDonald Scholarship



W.H. "Shorty" McDonald was from Tryon, NC. He earned a degree in 1932 from Wake Forest University and began his career as a history and math teacher at Mill Springs High School. He was later named principal and held this position until 1944. He served in the NC House of Representative, as a trustee of Western Carolina University, St. Luke's Hospital, the Congregationalist Church, president of the Tryon Christian Laymen's League, the Rotary Club and Tryon Chamber of Commerce. The scholarship was given by Mildred McDonald Furches and her husband, D.L. "Doc" to honor Mrs. Furches' brother.

- Must be enrolled in 12 or more credit hours
- Must have declared a major
- Must demonstrate financial need
- Must demonstrate motivation
- Must demonstrate good citizenship
- Must have solid high school achievement

Preference given to those filed FAFSA by May 31

CONTINUATION:

- Must enroll in 12 or more credit hours
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher

- * Must be motivated

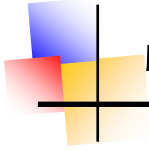
Preference given to those who attended Spindale Elementary

The Lou Anne Perkins Nelson Scholarship was established by John and Geraldine Perkins in honor of their daughter.

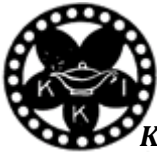


Pi Chapter Kappa Kappa Iota Scholarship

- Must be enrolled in 9 or more credit hours.



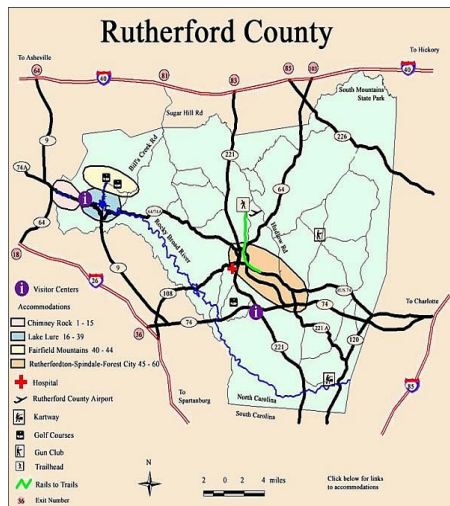

- Must be enrolled in AA, AS, Business Science, Applied Science or Technology Division 2 year program

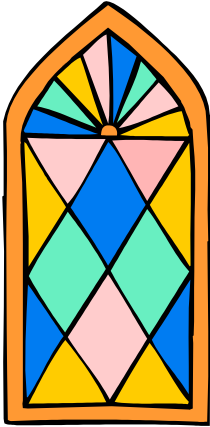

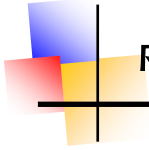

The Robert R. Spratt Scholarship was given in memory of Robert R. Spratt, a beloved trustee of Isothermal Community College who served in that capacity from 1964 until his untimely death in 1978. As a charter member of our board of trustees, Mr. Spratt possessed an in depth vision of what Isothermal Community College could mean to this community. His vision as a concerned educator, benefited the entire Rutherford County community.

Awarding Criteria:

PRIMARY

- * Must be a rising sophomore
- * Must be enrolled in one of the following majors:
 - A45120 - Nursing
 - A45110 - Nursing
 - D45660 - LPN
 - A5522B -Early Childhood-Teacher Associate
 - A55220 - Early Childhood Associate
- * Must be a Rutherford County resident
- * Must show academic promise
- * Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

CONTINUATION

- * Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher



State Employees' Credit Union Foundation Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

PRIMARY:

1. Must be a full-time student who is graduate of a NC high school, enrolled in an associate degree, diploma or certificate program.
2. Must be a resident of North Carolina eligible for in-state tuition.
3. Must demonstrate financial need with EFC between \$3601-\$5000.
4. Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
5. Must use scholarship to pay for tuition, books, fees, course supplies and transportation
6. Must continue at the college enrolled for the duration of the scholarship
7. Must not be a director, employee or family member of director or employee of State Employee's Credit Union or SECU Foundation.



The "People Helping People" Scholarship Program for community college students was established in 2004 by the State Employees' Credit Union Foundation. The scholarships were awarded for the first time in the fall of 2005 to students attending North Carolina community colleges. Each of the state's 58 community colleges were offered two scholarships during the 2005-06 academic year.



Wells Fargo Technical Scholarship

Awarding Criteria:

Primary:

- Must be enrolled as a full-time student
- Must be in the second year of a two-year technical program
- Must demonstrate financial need
- Must show scholastic promise



Established during the 1983-84 school year, the Wells Fargo Technology Scholarship was the first corporate scholarship made available to students through the North Carolina Community College System. Wells Fargo distributes 113 scholarships valued at \$500 each among the 58 colleges in the North Carolina Community College System each year.



Frank and Mabel West Scholarship



The beautiful, state-of-the art performing arts center in The Foundation on the Isothermal Community College campus, was named in honor of the Wests' as the Frank & Mabel West Auditorium.

Awarding Criteria:

PRIMARY

- Must be an immediate high school graduate
- Must be in the top 10% of graduating class; SAT, ASSET
- Must have letters of recommendation from high school teacher or counselor
- Must have a record of active community participation such as high school service clubs, church or volunteer service
- Must be a full-time student

Scholarship is not need based

CONTINUATION

- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher
- Must enroll in 12 or more credit hours

Scholarship is renewable for second year



Dr. J.F. and Ola H. Whisnant Scholarship



The Dr. and Mrs. JF Whisnant scholarship was established by Mrs. Lois W. Marriott in recognition of her parents.

Awarding Criteria:

PRIMARY

- Must be a first or second year student in the ADN program or second-level ADN student who has completed the PNE program and passed the licensure exam
- Must demonstrate financial need

Priority given to those who file FAFSA by May 31

CONTINUATION

- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher

The scholarship is renewable for second year if awarded to first year ADN student.



John Wallace Billingsley Memorial Scholarship

The John W. Billingsley Memorial Scholarship was established through the efforts of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Billingsley, Russ Bowen, and co-workers at WLOS-TV News 13. Mr. Billingsley grew up in Ellenboro in Rutherford County. One of three children, Mr. Billingsley attended Isothermal Community College and graduated from Appalachian State University with a degree in Communication Studies in 2004. At the time of his death, he was a photojournalist for WLOS-TV News 13 in Asheville, NC.

Awarding Criteria:

- Must be a second year Broadcasting and Production Technology student with plans to pursue a career in television, news, and/or photojournalism and is not need based.
- The scholarship will be awarded each semester and will be for tuition for one semester and is non-renewable.
- Preference will be given to Rutherford County Natives.
- The recipient will be selected by the ICC Scholarship Committee upon recommendation of the lead instructor in the BPT Program.
- Must be a full-time student with a cumulative 2.0 GPA
- The application process will include a written response by the applicant to the question, “Why are you interested in a career in TV, news, or photojournalism?”



Helen Ann Beam Nursing Scholarship

The Helen Ann Beam Nursing Scholarship Trust was established in 2001 by Ms. Beam to support the health care profession by assisting students pursuing careers in that area. In keeping with the traditions of the prominent Beam family of Rutherford County, North Carolina, Ms. Beam wished to carry on that family tradition by supporting the development of health care professional for the betterment of the people of Rutherford, Cleveland and Polk Counties.

Awarding Criteria:

- Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in the ADN or PNE Nursing Program at Isothermal
- Demonstrate potential by attaining a 2.5 GPA in all pre-nursing course work taken at either the high school or college level (chemistry, algebra, biology, etc.)
- Maintain successful academic progress as demonstrated by a 2.5 GPA while enrolled in the program
- Selected by the Scholarship Committee in consultation with a representative of the nursing faculty
- Be a resident of Rutherford or Polk County
- Up to \$1,000 per year with the number of recipients determined by the earnings on the trust

Continuation:

- Is renewable for second year, if criteria is met



Billy Andrew McDonald Scholarship

The Billy Andrew McDonald Scholarship was established through the trust of his sister, Mildred McDonald Furches. Billy McDonald retired from the US Armed Forces and at his death in 1977 served as an instructor for the Jr ROTC in Burke County. His wife, the former Marion Powers, lives in Rutherfordton.

Awarding Criteria:

- Based on need, motivation, solid achievement in high school and good citizenship
- No limitation to the high school that a student graduated from or the academic program for which they are enrolled
- Preference given to student previously enrolled in Jr ROTC program in high school
- Student must be full-time
- Recipient may attend Polk or Spindale Campus
- Any division of the college is eligible for this scholarship – Arts and Sciences, Applied Sciences and Technology, or Business Sciences

Continuation:

- Is renewable for second year, if criteria is met
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher



Charles D. Crawford Scholarship

The Charles D. Crawford Scholarship was established through the trust of his sister-in-law, Mildred McDonald Furches. Lt. Colonel Crawford attended R-S High School and joined the Army in 1937. During his military career he received a Silver Star, three Bronze Stars for valor, a Purple Heart, three Army commendation medals and five campaign ribbons. He retired from civil service with a combined 42 years in the service of his country. Upon retirement, he contributed to three books. He was married to Hazel Moore McDonald Crawford, sister of Mildred Furches, for 66 years.

Awarding Criteria:

- Based on need, motivation, solid achievement in high school and good citizenship
- No limitation to the high school that a student graduated from or the academic program for which they are enrolled
- Student must be full-time
- Recipient may attend Polk or Spindale Campus
- Any division of the college is eligible for this scholarship – Arts and Sciences, Applied Sciences and Technology, or Business Sciences

Continuation:

- Is renewable for second year, if criteria is met
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher



Loy Arthur Nash Scholarship

The Loy Arthur Nash Scholarship was established through the trust of his sister-in-law, Mildred McDonald Furches. Mr. Nash was born in Rutherford County and grew up on a plantation on Broad River. One of eight children, Mr. Nash was the only child to attend college and graduated from Duke University in 1925. He married Ruth McDonald in the McDonald home in Spindale in 1931 and moved to Durham to pursue a Masters degree from Duke. The Great Depression derailed those plans and he ultimately became a barber at Duke – a profession he worked at for 38 years during the day while writing in the evenings. He was an avid musician playing fiddle, harmonica and banjo. He was the author of a collection of barbershop stories, “The Crewcut”.

Awarding Criteria:

- Based on need, motivation, solid achievement in high school and good citizenship
- No limitation to the high school that a student graduated from or the academic program for which they are enrolled although preference will be given to students interested in music or broadcasting.
- Student must be full-time
- Recipient may attend Polk or Spindale Campus

Continuation:

- Is renewable for second year, if criteria is met
- Must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher



D.L. "Doc" & Mildred McDonald Furches Scholarship

In the 1990s, Mrs. Mildred McDonald Furches began establishing scholarships at Isothermal and over the years has recognized an aunt, three brothers, her parents, and two brother-in-laws. Born in Spindale, Mrs. Furches graduated from R-S Central High School and received the school's First Honor Medal. She graduated from East Carolina College and married Douthit Lawrence "Doc" Furches. Her husband was drafted into the army and later retired as a lieutenant colonel. "Doc" and Mildred were very involved in community activities and supportive of education. The scholarship was established posthumously after her death in 2009. "Doc" predeceased her in 1994.

Awarding Criteria:

- Based on need, motivation, solid achievement in high school and good citizenship
